### NOTATION KEY

Clark's Notation	Interpretation
Cross and examine S	cross the Columbia and explore the south side of the estuary for a campsite; however "S" might stand for "Sandy River" (Moulton V.6, 86)
Falls	the Great Falls of the Columbia, at the Dalles, Wasco County, Oregon (Moulton V.6, 86)
S.R.	"Sandy River," the Quicksand River, Multnomah County, Oregon (Moulton V.6, 86)
Lookout, up	exploring up the Columbia for a site (Moulton V.6, 86)
do	ditto, in standard 19th century historic practice (voted the same as person listed above)
